**INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY**

The Maybank Tiger Medium Term Peso Bond Fund primarily aims to achieve income and potential returns that are higher than regular deposit products by investing in a diversified portfolio of Peso denominated sovereign and corporate debt securities. Funds will not be invested in excluded industries identified in Maybank Group Sustainability Product Framework.

**CLIENT SUITABILITY**

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The Maybank Tiger Medium Term Peso Bond Fund is suitable for clients with at least a moderate risk profile and medium-term investment horizon. This Fund is for clients who desire potential returns higher than traditional bank deposits.





### OUTLOOK

As of December 2025, the Philippine fixed income market continues to operate within a landscape of moderating inflation, softening domestic growth, and a clearly accommodative monetary policy trajectory—conditions supportive of peso government securities. Inflation remained subdued through 2025 due mainly to declining food prices, particularly rice, providing the BSP room to cut policy rates in August and October 2025. Domestic activity, however, slowed in 2025, with GDP growth easing to 5.0% in Q1-Q3 as investment and services exports softened. These weaker growth dynamics contributed to a dovish policy shift, with the BSP delivering a cumulative 100 bps of rate cuts from April to late 2025, which pushed government bond yields lower across the curve. This improving rate environment helped sustain strong demand for peso government securities as investors repositioned for declining yields.

Looking into 2026, peso-denominated government bonds remain supported by expectations of continued monetary easing, stable inflation projections, and resilient issuance conditions—factors that are structurally beneficial for medium- to long-term peso bond funds. The BSP is anticipated to continue easing into 2026 to counter slowing growth, which could maintain downward pressure on yields and enhance the total-return potential of longer-duration securities. Inflation is projected to stay within target through 2026-2027, reinforcing a stable rate environment conducive to fixed-income performance. Meanwhile, the local currency bond market showed strength in 2025, with Q3 issuance expanding 7.3% quarter-on-quarter amid favorable funding conditions and strong investor appetite, including rising activity in sustainable bonds. For medium- to long-term peso bond funds, the key advantages include potential capital gains from falling yields, enhanced carry from a still-elevated yield base, and a supportive macro-policy backdrop that favors duration positioning—allowing such funds to generate competitive income and improve risk-adjusted returns as the rate-cutting cycle progresses.
