The Maybank Tiger Peso Short Term Fund primarily aims to achieve for its participants liquidity and slightly higher income potential by investing in a diversified portfolio of bank deposits and government bills. Funds will not be invested in excluded industries identified in Maybank Group Sustainability Product Framework.





OUTLOOK

As of late June 2025, the outlook for a Philippine money market fund is quite favorable, primarily due to the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas' (BSP) policy adjustments and a positive economic environment. In June, the BSP lowered its key policy rate by 25 basis points, a move that signals a more accommodating monetary stance. This decision was supported by the country's low and stable inflation, with June's rate at 1.4% and the full-year forecast at 1.6%. For money market funds, which invest in very short-term debt, this environment has been beneficial. Despite lower policy rates generally leading to a decrease in returns for new investments, these funds have performed well. Many have posted year-to-date returns between 2% and over 4%. This solid performance is a result of strong demand for government securities and overall economic stability.

With market analysts expecting further rate cuts from the BSP, money market funds are an excellent option for investors who prioritize capital preservation and liquidity. They offer a secure way to earn a modest return in a low-risk environment. The Fund will continue to capitalize on opportunities in higher-yielding securities while maintaining duration.
